

What is Saltwater?

- 1) Saltwater regions are also known as marine regions.
- 2) Saltwater regions include oceans and estuaries.
- 3) Coral reefs are barriers of coral on the ocean floor.
- 4) Estuary: a stream or river that merges with the ocean.
- 5) The Earth has 5 major oceans:

Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Artic, Southern

- 6) Algae takes in carbon dioxide and provides much of the Earth's oxygen supply.

What is Freshwater?

- 1) Freshwater regions include **ponds**, **lakes**, **rivers**, **streams**, and **wetlands**.
- 2) Freshwater regions can be divided into: standing bodies of water and floating bodies of water
- 3) Ponds are temporary, while lakes are permanent.
- 4) Rivers are formed by streams.
- 5) Freshwater contains less than 1% of salt.



- 6) Wetlands can be formed by:
 - glaciers, erosion, natural forces, beaver dams, and human engineering, such as irrigation systems and highway construction.
- 7) Animals of the freshwater regions include:
 - frogs, snails, trout, and cattails.
