How Our Lymphatic System Works

- Lymph drains into the lymph capillaries (tiny vessels)
- Fluid is pushed when the muscles contract.
- Lymph goes through the openings of the vessels and takes away any bacteria. This fluid is called interstitial fluid and is emptied into large veins in the upper chest.
- Lymph enters the lymph nodes where bacteria and foreign substances are destroyed macrophages.
- Clean fluid is returned to the bloodstream.
